







Rich and poor gap


Inequality has increased in all regions . . .

. . . except sub-Saharan Africa and the former Soviet Union.







Class Composition in Latin America












Dr. Tulio good afternoon today I am not writing to ask for help but to thank you with all my heart. My sister died on Sunday.




